Operating within an extensive network of over 800 partners, including grocery retailers serving as referral sources, the GCCSA Food Pantry effectively meets both urgent and sustained nutritional needs for hundreds of Harris County families, contributing significantly to the fight against hunger and malnutrition in our community.
